Distance Learning

As we have a number of families self-isolating for 14 days it's important we have plans in place to ensure the children's learning continues. It would help immensely if you follow the steps below; this will make sure the children are keeping a focus on learning during this period of absence.

NB – If you do not have access to the internet or you are unable to print certain sheets, please contact school. We can provide a hard copy of all the items below and will arrange for this to be handed over in a safe and convenient way.

1. 'Knowledge Organisers'

- Download the appropriate Knowledge Organiser from the website or the App
- Learn the facts that are shared on these and write them out practising their best handwriting.
- Learn how to spell the words in the key vocabulary section and make sure you know what they mean
- Do the activities in the try it at home section

2. Distance Learning Packs

- Download the 'Distance Learning Pack' from the appropriate year group on the website – if possible print the worksheets
- The cover sheet gives an outline of the activities to be carried out
- The additional sheets give further detail and guidance about what exactly should be done



3. Additional Activities

We would recommend the use of certain websites. The links for these are listed below. Activity Village is mainly aimed at Foundation Stage and Y1, whilst Twinkl has resources for children across the primary years.
