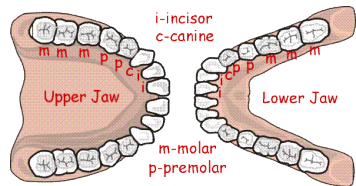
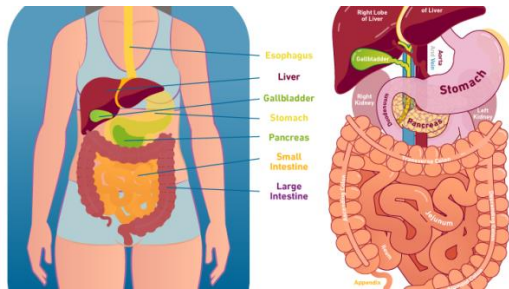


WOODTHORPE COMMUNITY PRIMARY KNOWLEDGE ORGANISER –Year 4 Science - Digestion

What will I be learning?

We will be learning that digestion begins in the mouth (with the teeth and saliva), moves into the stomach and then to the small and large intestines. We will learn that the different teeth have different jobs and are called incisors, canines and molars. We will interpret a variety of food chains, identifying producers (the plants, which use the sun to make their own food), predators (the animals that hunt for food) and prey (the animals that are food).

 - What happens in your stomach?
 - What happens in your intestines?
- What comes at the beginning of every food chain?

Key Vocabulary

Digestion	Breaking down food into its smallest substances that our bodies can use.
Proteins	A nutrient found in food that is essential for growth and repair.
Carbohydrates	A nutrient found in food that is used for energy.
Fat	A nutrient found in food to provide energy and vitamin D and K. It is the main way the body stores energy.
Dentition	The arrangement and condition of the teeth.
Deciduous teeth	The first set of teeth in growth and development of humans.
