

Distance learning tasks Year 3

1. **Learn spellings.** Use the Look, Say, Cover, Spell, Check sheet to practise and learn the common exception words for Year 3 and 4. Some of these we have learned in class already!
2. **Reading comprehensions.** Choose at least 3 of the reading comprehensions to complete. Read the information and then answer the questions below.
3. **SPaG.** There are 3 English, Grammar and Punctuation tests to work through. When you have completed the test, use the answer sheet to see how you did. Make a note of anything you found tricky.
4. **Reading.** Choose a book that you are interested in reading. Aim to read aloud to someone else for 15 minutes every day to improve your fluency. Read the classical poem *The Tyger* by William Blake. Learn two of the verses off by heart. Find another classical poem online to read.
5. **Writing.** Choose your favourite (or a well-known) children's author. Find information out about this author and write a fact-file about them. Choose one of the story settings and write your own story. There are some key words to help you. Your story can be about anything. Read over your story and check it is punctuated correctly.
6. **Maths.** Log on to TT Rock stars every day for at least 15 minutes to practise your times tables.
7. **Maths.** Complete both maths arithmetic tests. The answers are at the end for you to check when you have finished. Make a note of anything you found tricky.
8. **History.** Research what it was like to live in an Iron Age village – note down 5 interesting facts. Find out information about Stonehenge – make an information poster about this which includes pictures and facts. Find out 10 facts about The Romans (this will be your topic after Easter). Use the Romans word grid to help you and make sure that you know what all these words mean.
9. **Science** – use the Knowledge Organiser to learn key words linked to our Forces and Magnets topic. Complete the Plants word search, and make sure that you understand what each of these words mean (Plants will be your science topic after Easter).
10. **RE.** These religious events all take place in March or April. Choose 2 of these events to research and find out about; Easter (Christianity), Pesach (Judaism), Holi (Hinduism) and Ramadan (Islam). Feel free to find out about an additional religious festival that hasn't been mentioned here.
